Ambassador of Japan to Lebanon Receives Lebanese Athletes Participating in Tokyo Olympics

On Tuesday, July 13, 2021, OKUBO Takeshi, Ambassador of Japan to Lebanon, received at his residence three of the six Lebanese athletes qualified for the Tokyo Olympics - Ray Bassil (Shooting), Noureddine Hadid (Athletics Track and Field) and Gabriella Doueihy (Swimming) - to demonstrate his wish of their excellence in the upcoming international competition. The team of athletes were accompanied by Vartene Ohanian, Minister of Youth and Sports; Pierre Jalkh, President of the National Olympic Committee (NOC); Hassan Rustom, Secretary General of the National Olympic Committee; and Mazen Ramadan, Head of Delegation to Tokyo.

President Pierre Jalkh commemorated the gathering, stating their goal was not just to win a medal, but also to show the best image of Lebanon and to leverage the Tokyo Olympics—where gender-equal representation is achieved—in promoting the equality. Minister of Youth and Sports Vartene Ohanian expressed her appreciation for how the athletes had been advocating good imagery of Lebanon, believing their participation would bring in a sense of joy to the country.

Ambassador Okubo commended the athletes for their tireless commitment during the extraordinary circumstances due to a series of crisis and expressed that their participation would stand as a beacon of hope to Lebanon.
